The Partnership for Prescription Assistance (PPA) is a free, confidential service that helps connect uninsured and underinsured patients to programs that provide prescription medicines for free or nearly free.

Follow these steps to see how you may qualify

START



STEP 1

Search by product name to get a list of matching programs on the PPA website.



STEP 2

Download the application or go to the program website for more information.



STEP 3

Fill out the application and gather any necessary documents.



STEP 4

Return completed application and all necessary documents to the specific program.



STEP 5

Receive your prescriptions once your application is approved.
